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Methodology

The survey of 1,000 Registered Voters in Wisconsin was conducted by Scott Rasmussen using a mixed mode approach from August 22-28, 2021. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Most respondents were contacted online while 225 were contacted using automated phone polling techniques. Online respondents were selected from a list of Registered Voters and through a process of Random Digital Engagement. Certain quotas were applied to the overall sample and lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, and political party to reasonably reflect the state's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

On question 8, the word "uniformly" was not included in the wording presented to a number of respondents. However, there was no significant difference between the results with or without that word included.

Forty-four percent (44%) of survey respondents cast their ballot for Joe Biden in 2020. An identical 44% voted for Donald Trump. Three percent (3%) say they voted for some other candidate, 7% did not vote, and 2% are not sure.

Margin of Sampling Error for Full Sample: +/- 3.1 percentage points.
