

Parents Bill of Rights

PARENTS HAVE A RIGHT TO DIRECT THEIR CHILD'S EDUCATION

The pandemic highlighted the public school establishment's preference for their own policies and beliefs over parents. SB 962 creates fundamental rights for parents in state law and a process to hold the state accountable for an infringement of those rights.

SB 962 addresses specific issues raised by Wisconsin parents over the last few years:



Putting federal rights from the Pupil Rights Amendment for public school parents into state law.



Ensuring that educational materials are available to parents when requested.



Addressing concerns about student safety and parental notifications.



Preventing districts from applying gender pronouns and names to students without their parent's knowledge or permission.



Empowering parents to make decisions about their child's classes and access to certain curriculum and material.
